Products of animal origin may carry pathogens that
cause infectious diseases in animals.

**There are strict procedures and veterinary controls on the introduction
of products of animal origin into the European Union*.**

*If you travel between the Member States of the European Union, Andorra, Iceland, Liechtenstein, United Kingdom (Northern Ireland), Norway, San Marino or Switzerland, you may bring products of animal origin in your luggage. Arrivals from the Faroe Islands or from Greenland: not more than 10 kg in your luggage. Arrivals from parts of the United Kingdom other than Northern Ireland (England, Wales, Scotland) are subject to normal procedures and veterinary controls.

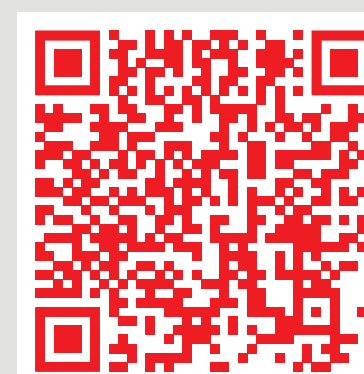
